2018-19 Credential Renewal Reminder and Information

The November 30th real property appraiser credential renewal deadline is fast approaching. If you have not yet renewed your credential, please take note of the following:

If a completed application (renewal application; education certificates, if required; fingerprint cards, if required; and other required supporting information) is not received at the Board's office by November 30, 2017, a credential holder will have until July 1, 2018 to meet the requirements. A late processing fee of \$25.00 will be assessed for each month or portion of a month the credential is not renewed beginning on December 1, 2017. If a credential holder obtained his or her credential at the current level on or after November 1, 2017, the late processing fee does not apply until January 1, 2018.

With the exception of a credential holder who obtained his or her credential at the current level after November 30, 2017, but before January 1, 2018, all applications received after November 30, 2017 will go before the Board for review. Once a completed application is processed by board staff, the application is prepared for Board review at its next regular meeting. The Board may choose to take additional action, or approve the application with an advisory letter informing the applicant of the proper submission date for renewal of a credential. If an application received at the Board's office is incomplete, or the required continuing education documentation is missing, the application will be returned to the credential holder with a letter from the Board outlining any deficiencies.

In the unlikely event the criminal history record check has not been returned to the Board's office by the State Patrol prior to December 31st for those selected for a random criminal history record check, the Board may renew a credential subject to receipt of this record check. All other requirements for renewal must have been met prior to the November 30th deadline for this contingent approval.

Each credential holder who successfully renews his or her credential after the second year of a two-year credential period will receive one free download of the PDF version of the 2018-19 Edition of USPAP through Appraiser Login. The PDF may be printed for personal use once download is complete. When an application received at the Board's office has been processed by board staff, a postcard will be mailed to the credential holder stating that the requirements for renewal of the real property appraiser credential have been met. This postcard will include directions for printing a copy of the credentialing card through the Appraiser Login on the Board's website.

Finally, any person who does not obtain renewal of his or her real property appraiser credential prior to January 1, 2018 is not authorized to engage in real property appraisal activity until renewal is approved by the Board. Per Neb. Rev. Stat. § 76-2246, "Any person required to be credentialed by the Real Property Appraiser Act who engages in real property appraisal activity or who advertises or holds himself or herself out to the general public as a real property appraiser or real property associate in this state without obtaining proper credentialing under the act shall be guilty of a Class III misdemeanor and shall be ineligible to apply for credentialing under the act for a period of one year from the date of his or her conviction of such offense. The board may, in its discretion, credential such person within such one-year period upon application and after an administrative hearing."

NRPAB Quick Hits:

- Board Member Chris Langemeier's term as the At-large Licensed Real Estate Broker/Credentialed Appraiser representative expires on December 31, 2017, and Board Member David Bloxham accepted a promotion that requires relocating to Colorado. David's last day as At-large Representative of Financial Institutions on the Board was November 1, 2017. The State of Nebraska is currently accepting applications to fill these positions on the Board.
 - * Anyone interested in the At-large Licensed Real Estate Broker/Credentialed Appraiser representative position must hold a current license as a Real Estate Broker, and hold a current Licensed or Certified Real Property Appraiser credential. The term for this position will run for five years, beginning on January 1, 2018.
 - * Anyone interested in the At-large Representative of Financial Institutions position is not required to hold a credential as a licensed or certified real property appraiser, and does not represent any of the three congressional districts; therefore no boundary restrictions apply. The term for this position will run through the remainder of David's term, ending on January 1, 2019.

 - * The application can be found on the Governor's website at www.governor.nebraska.gov. Select the dropdown titled "Constituent Services" at the top of the page, then select "Boards and Commissions." The Board hopes to have new members appointed prior to its January 2018 meeting.
- ♦ The Board thanks the University of Nebraska—Lincoln and Professor Jeff Stokes for the opportunity to discuss the real property appraiser profession and the appraiser qualifications criteria with students who represent the future of the industry. Director Kohtz gave a presentation to approximately forty students in the Farm and Rural Property Appraisal Capstone Course on October 30, 2017. The students were engaged during the presentation and asked very well thought out and detailed questions.

NRPAB Quick Hits:

- Director Kohtz attended the Fall AARO Conference from October 13th through 16th in Washington, D.C. Much of the discussion centered on residential appraisals, specifically evaluations, and potential appraiser qualifications changes. The Director noted the following highlights:
 - * Recently, the industry has seen an increase in evaluations used in the place of full appraisals for residential mortgage loan transactions below the de minimis as determined by the federal financial institutions. The discussions at AARO consisted of two distinct points of view, one being that traditional appraisals are being phased out, and the other being that change is taking place and the profession needs to adjust. Evaluations are restricted reports, so USPAP compliance is still required by appraisers performing evaluation assignments. Furthermore, all laws of the Nebraska Real Property Appraiser Act apply to evaluation assignments.
 - The criteria changes discussed nearly mirror the last exposure draft issued by The Appraisal Foundation. The proposed changes being discussed include reducing education requirements for the licensed and certified residential level, reducing experience requirements for all levels, developing applied an application option for experience, and allowing a streamlined path from the licensed residential to the certified residential level.

- * The Appraisal Subcommittee is putting its finishing touches on the ASC Policy Statements related to the AMC Final Rule and rules for the administration of the AMC Federal Register.
- * A presentation was made to encourage states to adopt the ANSI Standards as the universal standard for home measurement. It is believed that utilizing a recognized standard of measurement would resolve many of the variances found within the different sources that include a home's square footage.
- * A presentation on active shooter readiness focused on psychological reactions during such an event and why it is important to develop and visualize a plan.

- The Nebraska Real Property Appraiser Board ("Board") intends to have a legislative bill introduced during the 2018 legislative session to update the Nebraska Real Property Appraiser Act ("Act") for compliance with Title XI of the Financial Institutions reform, Recovery, and Enforcement Act of 1989 ("Title XI"), the Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice ("USPAP"), and the Policy Statements of the Appraisal Subcommittee of the Federal Financial Institutions Examination Council ("ASC Policy Statements"). Request for public comments ran through Tuesday, October 31, 2017, and the Board is now preparing for the introduction of the bill.





Real Property Appraiser and AMC Numbers and Trends as of October 1, 2017

The charts below outline the five year trend for the number of Nebraska credentialed real property appraisers and Nebraska registered appraisal management companies up to October 1, 2017. There are currently 686 licensed residential, certified residential, and certified general real property appraisers in Nebraska, and 53 credentialed trainee real property appraisers. In addition, there are currently 105 appraisal management companies registered in Nebraska.





NRPAB Financial Snapshot as of September 30, 2017

For the Real Property Appraiser Program, which includes both the appraiser fund and the AMC fund, a total of \$99,898.20 in expenditures and \$40,289.24 in revenues were recorded as of September 30, 2017. Actual expenses registered at 21.98 percent of the budgeted expenditures for the fiscal year; 25.21 percent of the fiscal year has passed. The Board began receiving real property appraiser credential renewal applications at the end of August, which will drive revenues for the next quarter. By the end of December, revenues received should exceed 70 percent of the projected revenues for the fiscal year.

What's Your Number?

Are you often confused, irritated, or just down right fed up? No, this article is not about a certain football team. For years, the Board utilized a somewhat archaic education activity numbering system that made it difficult for staff to verify an activity for approval. For instance, many activities offered by different education providers were assigned the same number. During early summer of this year, the Board developed and implemented a new activity numbering system to improve the staff's ability to understand the status of an activity based on the assigned number, which in turn will improve staff efficiency while reviewing education activities for renewal of real property appraiser credentials. Once approved by the Board, the new activity numbers were retroactively applied to all active education activities to create a sense of unity across the numbering system. Any certificate for an education activity completed in the State of Nebraska after August 1, 2017 will include the new number format, which consists of nine digits, all of which have their own significance. Below is an illustration explaining the new activity numbering system.
