2018-19 Credential Renewal Processes and Procedures

Real property appraiser credential renewal deadlines are approaching. Nebraska credential holders should review the following information regarding the 2018-19 renewal process.

- The following must be mailed to the Board's • office postmarked by November 30, 2017: completed renewal application form, all fees, all required continuing education documentation (NEW - USPAP and/or Report Writing documentation is now required with a renewal application in the year taken, not just at the end of a CE period), and fingerprint cards or date of electronic fingerprint submission (if notified of random selection by registered mail). All incomplete applications will be returned. Applications missing anv required accompanying documentation are considered incomplete. The entire two-year continuing education period must be satisfactorily completed prior to applying for a two-year renewal.
- If all required information is not received at the Board's office postmarked by November 30, 2017, a credential holder will have until July 1, 2018 to meet the requirements. A late processing fee of \$25.00 will be assessed for each month or portion of a month the credential is not renewed beginning on December 1, 2017. (The late processing fee does not apply until January 1, 2018 for new or upgraded credentials issued on or after November 1, 2017.)
- All applications received after November 30, 2017 will go before the Board for review, except applications to renew new or upgraded credentials issued after November 30, 2017 and before January 1, 2018. If a late application is incomplete or missing required continuing education documentation, fingerprint submission, or late fees, the application will be returned to the credential holder.

- In September, notification postcards will be mailed to appraisers whose credentials expire December 31, 2017. The postcards will include directions for downloading the application and renewing the credential. The 2018-19 renewal application form will not be mailed to credential holders.
- When an application received at the Board's office has been processed by board staff, a postcard will be mailed to the credential holder stating that the requirements for renewal of the real property appraiser credential have been met. This postcard will include directions for printing a copy of the credentialing card through the Appraiser Login on the Board website (see picture below).



If the requirements for renewal of a credential have not been met, the application will be returned to the credential holder, with a letter from the Board outlining any deficiencies and explaining the next step. If the Board has not received required criminal history record check results from the State Patrol prior to December 31, 2017 the Board may renew a credential subject to receipt of the CHRC results. All other requirements for renewal must have been met prior to the November 30th deadline for this contingent approval.

2018-19 Credential Renewal Processes and Procedures (Continued)

- A credential holder may elect an inactive status. This status allows an appraiser the ability to maintain his or her credential if he or she is unable to practice for a short amount of time. The inactive status application can be found on the Board's website at: <u>http://www.appraiser.ne.gov/</u> <u>Appraiser Credentialing/</u>.
- The Board may adopt a program of continuing education for an individual credential holder as long as the program is compliant with the Appraiser Qualifications Board's criteria specific to continuing education. To make a request for an individualized program of continuing education, a credential holder shall submit a letter to the Board explaining the circumstances which are the basis for the request and the reason(s) why the existing continuing education requirements are a hardship on the credential holder.
- Each credential holder that successfully renews his or her credential after the second year of a two-year credential period will receive one free download of the PDF version of the 2018-19 Edition of USPAP through Appraiser Login (see picture below). The PDF may be printed for your personal use once download is complete. 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 Effective January 1, 2015, all Trainee Real Property Appraisers are required to submit continuing education every two years instead of every four years. No adjustments will be made for those on a four year cycle ending on December 31, 2015 or December 31, 2016. However, if a Trainee Real Property Appraiser's four year cycle was to end on December 31, 2017 or December 31, 2018, his or her continuing education cycle has been changed to a cycle beginning January 1, 2015 and ending December 31, 2016.

NRPAB Quick Hits:

- LB17 was introduced by Senator Craighead on January 5, 2017 to update the Nebraska Appraisal Management Company Registration Act ("Act") for compliance with Title XI of the Financial Institutions Reform, Recovery, and Enforcement Act of 1989 ("Title XI"), the AMC Final Rule, and the requirements of the Appraisal Subcommittee of the Federal Financial Institutions Examination Council. The hearing before the Banking, Commerce and Insurance Committee took place on January 24, 2017, and the bill was placed on General File with an 8-0 committee vote. LB17 is expected to be on the Legislature's agenda on the second day of the 2018 session.
- LB867, operative on January 1, 2017, changed the Administrative Procedure Act to better define what is a rule or regulation. LB867 also defined and provided for implementation of guidance documents and internal procedural documents. For years the Board utilized board policies to provide clarity or interpretation regarding the application of a statute or rule. At its regular meeting on May 24, 2017, the Board retired all active board policies and the "Guidelines for 7-Hour Supervisory Appraiser and Trainee Course."

NRPAB Quick Hits:

- Pursuant to Title XI of the Financial Institutions Reform, Recovery, and Enforcement Act of 1989 (Title XI), the Appraisal Subcommittee (ASC) of the Federal Financial Institutions Examination Council monitors each State's appraiser licensing and certification regulatory program to ensure the State:
 - Recognizes and enforces the standards, requirements and procedures pre-scribed by Title XI;
 - (2) Has adequate authority to permit it to carry out its Title XI-related functions; and
 - (3) Makes decisions concerning appraisal standards, appraiser qualifications and supervision of appraiser practices consistent with Title XI.

The ASC performed an on-site Compliance Review of the State of Nebraska Appraiser Regulatory Program in early March of 2017, and the State's program has received an ASC Finding of Good. 



Real Property Appraiser and AMC Numbers and Trends as of July 1, 2017

The charts below outline the five year trend for the number of Nebraska credentialed real property appraisers and Nebraska registered appraisal management companies up to July 1, 2017. There are currently 674 licensed residential, certified residential, and certified general real property appraisers in Nebraska, and 57 credentialed trainee real property appraisers. In addition, there are currently 104 appraisal management companies registered in Nebraska.



Real Property Appraiser Renewal Report as of June 30, 2017

The charts below outline the real property appraiser renewal counts and percentages as of June 30, 2017. There were 661 trainee, licensed residential, certified residential, and certified general real property appraiser renewals due, and 585 credentials have been renewed.



NRPAB Financial Snapshot as of June 30, 2017

The 2016-17 Fiscal Year ended with \$360,383.67 in expenditures and \$349,541.47 in receivables. As of the end of June, actual expenses registered at 72.88 percent of the budgeted expenditures; revenues finished at 112.05 percent of the budgeted revenues for the fiscal year. The lower than expected expenditures is attributed to a lower utilization of funds for other contractual services due to a smaller than expected number of Standard 3 reviews for investigations and applicants, and data processing expenses were below budget due to little work being completed on the Board's database during the fiscal year; only 20.69 percent of this budgeted amount for the fiscal year was utilized. Revenues exceeded projections due to a higher number of appraisers electing to renew for two years in lieu of one, and the number of new applicants increased significantly during this fiscal year compared to the 2015-16 Fiscal Year. AMC revenues were also strong for this fiscal year as a greater number of AMCs renewed registrations compared to projections and the number of new applications.

Don't Wait, Find a Date

Summer is coming to an end and school is about to start back up, but not just for the kids. With 2018-2019 credential renewals just around the corner, your continuing education cycle might be coming to an end and the seven-hour Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice ("USPAP") Update Course may be due. It is imperative that you complete this requirement at least once during the past two years for renewal of your credential.

According to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 76-2236(3) states, As prescribed by rules and regulations of the Real Property Appraiser Board and at least once every two years, the seven-hour National Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice Update Course as approved by the Appraiser Qualifications Board as of January 1, 2016, or the equivalent of the course as approved by the Real Property Appraiser Board, shall be included in the continuing education requirement of each credential holder. The seven-hour National Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice Update Course or an equivalent of the course as approved by the board shall:

(a) Be taken in a classroom and not online or by correspondence;

(b) Be approved by the board as a continuing education activity for the duration the course is approved by the Appraiser Qualifications Board as of January 1, 2016; and

(c) Be taught by an instructor certified by the Appraiser Qualifications Board to teach the Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice and who is a state-certified appraiser in good standing."

Therefore, if the last time you attended an USPAP Update Course was in 2015, find a date to take the course before the end of the year.
